- Make no unnecessary noise


Please take care and wear footwear with a good grip. Also please note that cattle and horses may threaten dogs.

Parish Footpaths, Bridleways and Lanes



Walk No.) Lingston

Distance: 0.6 miles (1 km)

This short circular walk starts outside the church of St James the Less and the Dolphin Inn, and follows lanes and field edges.

Follow the uphill lane alongside the church. Turn left at the crossroads at Wonwell Gate, and then right at the T-junction by the thatched cottage "Hillside".

You will pass the entrance to the village Play Park and playing fields on your right. Ignore the wooden gate immediately to your left, and continue along the lane for about 100 yards to go through the next wooden gate into a field. Once through the gate you will see, a few yards to the right, the memorial seat to the late Morin Ness, villager and Parish Councillor. Here you can sit and enjoy the views over Okenbury Farm, with the spires of both Bigbury and Malborough churches on the skyline.

[This field is designated a public Open Space under the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000. However, the landowners may close access for a limited number of days each year, provided due notice is given.]

Drop down a grassy track, alongside the fence, to the bottom of the field. There turn left and follow the hedge to join Wiscombe Lane. Turn left into the lane, which shortly becomes a metalled road leading up to a T-junction. Turn right, then left, to complete your circuit.

For those who wish to visit the Dolphin before or after their walk, parking is available in the pub car park. There is limited parking by the church; otherwise you must park where you can in the Village – please do so with due attention to the needs of residents' access and working agricultural vehicles.
